There is life after life! But what is it? What will it be like?

## 3/17 "When God Doesn't Answer"

We pray and pray and pray....and there is silence from God. Why? If God is loving why doesn't God answer us?

## 3/24 "Why do People Suffer?"

This is the question of the ages. As we enter into Holy Week, a week that ended with the profound suffering of Jesus, we can't help but ask why?

I hope that you will join us for worship, for study and in opportunities to serve others, as we go through this Holy Seasons.
