FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART

Some months when I need to write this front page, I already have an idea of what I am going to write. Then there are months where so much is swirling in my brain I'm not sure where to go. In times like this I write in sort of a free form – thoughts that are just there, that might give you something to encourage you or something to think about. So here we go! STRENGTH...Every single day I am aware of people who need strength to face their moments and their days. People who are caring for aging parents, people who have long term health issues, people who are grieving...the list goes on and on. But folks, understand that this strength we all need – isn't of our own making – it is God's strength. It is only God's strength that does run out, it is only God's strength that carries us through these times. One of the bravest people I know, who is also dealing with long term health issues, said to me not long ago: "Pastor Nancy, my strength has run out long ago. This is all God's strength." FORGIVENESS: I've been thinking a lot about this. Partly because it is in the Lord's Prayer that we are studying, but partly because this world, and all of us as individuals, so desperately need forgiveness and to forgive others. How different our lives would be – our world would be -if forgiveness became our lifestyle. Understand when I speak of forgiveness, I am speaking of the Bible's definition of forgiveness, not the world's. The world's definition is 'it's no problem,' 'it is what it is' – but is that really forgiveness. Forgiveness means to let go of, to release the resentment and the anger and the right to revenge. LET IT GO...not for them, but for yourself. Carrying those hurts and wounds around hurts us, not the ones who have hurt us. FORGIVENESS IS SOMETHING WE DO FOR OURSELVES AND MUST LEARN TO SHARE WITH OTHERS.

We are more than willing to accept God's mercy and grace in our lives – we need it! But the challenge is in the call to forgive others – that's not fun! In 2 Timothy, Paul speaks of a time when he was badly hurt and betrayed by someone. The Greek word indicates something big – not the little things that so often offend us. What does Paul do with all that anger and bitterness? He prays for those who hurt him!! And then he releases all that hurt to God – and basically says God will take care of me. THIS IS A HARD THING...but it is the healthy thing for us emotionally and spiritually. FORGIVE US OUR DEBTS AS WE FORGIVE OUR DEBTORS.
