CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA WORLD HUNGER ASSOCIATION

The Central PA World Hunger Association will be having their 50th Annual Meat Canning Project at the Chief Logan Fire Company, Main Station, in Lewistown, PA on February 10-14, 2025.

We are planning to can 43,000 pounds of chicken this year, which will be 11,000 more than last year.

We work with MCC and use their mobile canner, and they direct where 90% of the meat goes worldwide. We pay all the production and shipping costs, and we distribute 10% of the meat in our five-county area. Please understand that we do not receive any financial help from MCC for our project, all monies come from our donations. So please direct all contributions for the project to the address below. Your donation is tax deductible, and we will give you our tax number upon request.

If you, your church, or group would like to take part in the actual canning of the meat this year, you must contact Jesse Diem, 717-348-9577, Sylvanus Peachey (canning coordinator), 717-935-2511 or Jonathan Coldren, 717-250-6840, as soon as possible. Our coordinators work to set an accurate schedule for those taking part in the project. If you are planning to be a walk-in, we urge you to call in for a time to help.

We appreciate your needed help to accomplish this important service.

HIGHLAND'S MONTHLY MISSION: OUR JANUARY MISSION IS: BETHESDA MISSION: Bethesda Mission has been providing hope and healing to hurting and homeless people in the Harrisburg area since 1914. 2023 Statistics are as follows: *95 men were sheltered, *35 women were sheltered, *104,289 meals were served, *10,328 medical patient visits, *1,317 dental patient seen. *140 men and women enrolled in long-term recovery programs, *82 children and teens attending community center programs and *41 veterans stayed at the mission...
