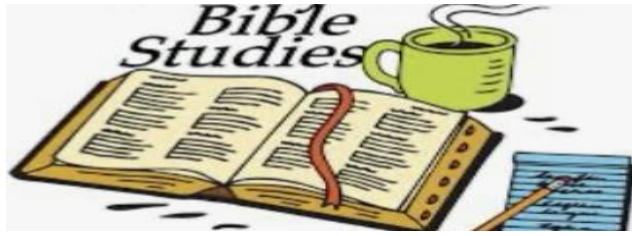

## BIG BIG NEWS —

Mission is taking on a new, very rewarding project, but we need everyone's help.

We are working with Homeland Hospice to make meals for those under the care of hospice. If you have ever had a loved one or friend under hospice care, you know how hard it is to take care of them both physically and mentally. By making meals for both the patient and caregiver, we are trying to help them by making life a little easier, so they can spend valuable time with their loved ones. There are certain regulations that we must follow.

All dinners must be put in an 8" x 8" aluminum pan, baked, then covered with aluminum foil, placed in a one-gallon freezer bag. On the paper provided, you must print the name of the dish, list the ingredients and rewarming directions.

All soups must be in a 32 ounce plastic soup container with lids. Here again, print the name of the soup, list the ingredients and rewarming directions.

Your Mission Committee has already bought the required containers, for anyone interested in helping make meals and soups. The committee has also bought a freezer that will hold all these homemade meals and soups, until arrangements can be made for pickup. This program serves people in York, Dauphin, Cumberland, and Perry Counties.

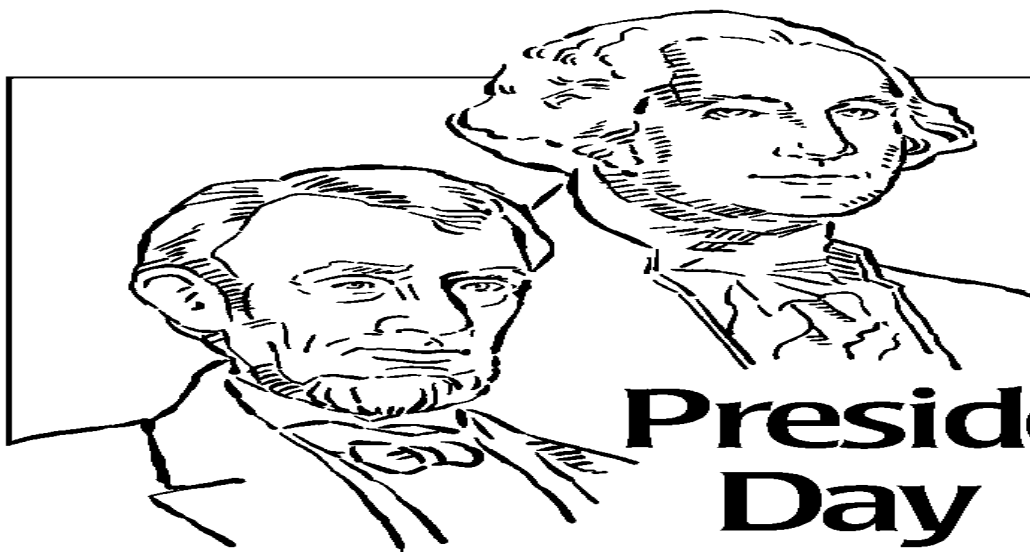
